Harold Grubin, M.D. Clinic and Health Center

The Columbia-Greene Humane Society/SPCA (CGHS/SPCA) is excited to announce the opening of the Harold Grubin, M.D. Clinic and Health Center for animals. The new clinic offers blood, urine, and fecal testing for animals as well as examinations and surgery at a reduced cost to the owner.

The late Dr. Harold Grubin, an internist and surgeon, was a Major in the U.S. Army. During World War II, he served in the Philippines during combat operations in the Asiatic-Pacific Theatre. He built a hospital from scratch in a rural part of the Philippine Islands to which servicemen injured in combat were brought. The hospital also provided medical care to Filipinos who had not previously had a health facility. After returning from the war, Dr. Grubin became a boardcertified pathologist and the head of the laboratory in a hospital in New Jersey. His laboratory won many awards. He installed new equipment that enabled the lab to provide low-cost and rapid testing, tissue diagnosis, bacteriology, parasitology, and other studies to the community, much like CGHS/SPCA will now be able to provide for animals. In honor of Dr. Grubin, his daughter Sharon has made it possible for CGHS/SPCA to institute the in-house clinic and laboratory with state-of-theart testing equipment to assist pet owners who have limited incomes. Over the past nine years, the Amy Ryan Band has gained an enthusiastic following for their high-energy blend of blues, rock, and soul. 



friendship formed. and A graduate of Harvard Medical School, Dr. Crum gained renown both for his biochemistry research and a concern for humanity. He was awarded a Harvard Medical Student Research Fellowship and merited Honor grades for his research, and holds a Master of Science degree from New York University, and a Doctor of Science (Hon.) degree from the University of Redlands (CA).

Dr. Crum has been called into counsel or Audiences with many world leaders, including an Audience with Pope John Paul II, now Pope Saint John Paul II, and with His Holiness the Dalai Lama and many others. First Aid/At-Home Care for Pets

Julianne Porter, DVM Many of us have experienced one of these situations: Imagine, it's 5pm on a weekday, and your pet decides to eat a bag of chocolates or check out a bee and now has a swollen face. It's 3am Sunday morning and your pet has a seizure for the first time or has blow-out diarrhea. Or it's a Holiday, and your pet cuts their leg or rips a nail and is bleeding. We cannot predict when pet emergencies happen, but it sure seems to be at the most inconvenient times. Due to the unpredictable nature of pet emergencies, it is good to have a first-aid kit at home and be as prepared as possible so that you can help your pet when time is of the essence. Even when it's not imperative or possible to get to a veterinarian right away, it is good to know

what to do in the meantime. First and foremost, know your veterinary hospital's hours and the information to the closest emergency and/or specialty hospitals for when your regular veterinarian is not available. It is also important to establish a relationship with a veterinarian before an emergency arises. That way, if you are able to call and speak with them, they can help you more readily than if your pet is not a patient at their practice. Know the distance and time it takes to get the animal hospitals near you (or where you may be staying during travel) and have their phone numbers readily available.

Also, if your pet ingested something that it shouldn't have, save these numbers so you call one of these companies: ASPCA Animal Poison Control: 888-426-4435 Pet Poison Helpline: 855-764-7661

The resources above can help you to determine if what your pet ate is indeed dangerous, and what actions should be implemented. They can also advise you how to safely induce vomiting if needed, as well as let you know if you need to go directly to an ER, or if your pet can wait to be treated.

First Aid Kits are excellent to have. If you have these supplies readily available to help your pet, they can help reduce panic and increase efficiency. You can include the phone numbers of your veterinarian, local animal emergency centers, and the poison control hotlines kit as well. Your kit should also include: A muzzle (in case your pet is in pain and trying to bite while you're trying to help), a slip leash, nonstick bandages, adhesive tapes for bandages, a rectal thermometer, antiseptic solution such as chlorhexidine or iodine, 3% hydrogen peroxide, Benadryl (Diphenhydramine), and syringes of various sizes (to administer oral liquid medications or syringe feed). Some people will include other medications such as antidiarrheal, anti-vomiting, or antiinflammatory prescriptions, but it is very important to discuss these with your veterinarian ahead of time to make sure these are safe for your pet. Medications such as Tylenol, Ibuprofen, and Aspirin can be toxic and detrimental to your pet's health. Tylenol is lethal to cats and Imodium can be very dangerous for some dogs. Sometimes, a seemingly safe mediation may not be right for your individual pet due to their health status and concurrent illnesses or medications. Refer to this link for Basic First Aid Procedures: https://www. avma.org/resources/pet-owners/ emergencycare/pet-first-aidbasic-procedures. This page includes information in regards to toxin exposure, wounds, trauma, choking, burns, heatstroke, performing seizures, and CPR. It is important to have a plan for these emergencies since they'll (almost) never happen right outside of an veterinary open hospital.

Emergencies don't usually happen when it is convenient. Being as prepared as possible will enable you to efficiency help your pet and could help to save their life.

For those unfamiliar with the concept, it's like a self-serve car wash. They have professional tubs, dryers, and other tools available to wash and dry your own dog. At first, Dakota was a little unsure of what was going on, so I spent a little time making sure she was calm and I let her get used to her surroundings.

The wash basins are an ample size, mounted a few feet high and stable; accessible by stairs with a BIG step down into the tub.

Dakota is used to stairs, so I told her to go up. She sat down!! I tried once more. "Dakota up.", while giving the leash just a little pull but she wasn't budging. The clerk came over and asked if I needed help. I thanked her but declined. I did however ask if the tub would support both Dakota and me. She said it should and I knew right away what I needed to do. So, I climbed the narrow steps to the platform and she happily



experience I can personally vouch for it because, I know it works."



I stood up, gave her a calm, quiet correction and called her again. When she reached a paw toward the tub, I encouraged her. "Good girl" and when she stepped down into the tub she was greeted by lots of happy praise. I petted her and scratched her ears and chest, which she loves, and I stayed in the tub with her until I was sure she was calm and relaxed. I told her to "stay" and then I climbed out of the tub and down the stairs.

Dakota actually likes baths, so she was happy throughout

the bath. Afterwards, when it was time to get dried off, she readily climbed out of the tub onto the platform. She shook off and soaked me in the process which she seemed to enjoy. Maybe her way of bathing me.

Dakota likes being toweled off, but she wasn't initially comfortable with the blow dryer. So I turned it on and aimed it away letting her get used to the sound. Then I turned it toward myself before I aimed it toward her paws from a distance. She stood calmly so I proceeded to blow her dry.

Throughout the process I watched for signs of stress. I gave her lots of praise and positive feedback for remaining calm. I slowed things down and gave her

a quiet correction any time she started to get nervous and overall, we had a positive experience.

I watched other people come in to use the dog wash but no one else climbed into the tub. Most people picked their dogs up and put them in the tubs. I didn't see one other dog climb the stairs or enter a tub on his own. One young puppy was very scared and feverishly tried to crawl back out the door upon arrival. Her owner grabbed her around the stomach, lifted her up off the floor and swung her into the tub. I can't imagine that was a pleasant experience for an already stressed pup and as we were leaving, I noticed the pup's tail was tucked and she cowered in the tub. That owner certainly did not take the opportunity to create a positive association for that young pup.

If I had pushed Dakota too fast or not taken the time to show and guide, she would likely have been nervous or scared. She trusts me and I know that trust must be earned and needs reinforcement with each new situation. If I'm patient and show her what to do, she'll do her best to follow my direction. When you take the time to build trust with your dog and you're careful not to break that trust, the bonds grow stronger. Dakota is a dog, not a person, but just as trust is important with our human relationships, it's also important with our canine ones. Take the time to teach your dog.
